

On Wednesday, August 31, the home of The Art Guild of Port Washington, Inc., was forced to close after an electrical fire damaged part of the historic Hewlett-Munson-Williams House on the 3.5 acre Elderfields Historic Preserve. The damage caused us to dismantle the *Bold* photography show and cancel all upcoming shows scheduled for Elderfields. As of now, all classes, workshops and programs that are usually held at Elderfields are canceled until further notice.

Thanks to The Manhasset Public Library we do have an upcoming members show planned. *Home Away From Home* will run from December 4 to March 30, 2012 with an Artists' Reception and Awards Ceremony December 10, 2-4pm at the Manhasset Public Library, 30 Onderdonk Ave, Manhasset.

Nassau County is currently working to repair the building. At the same time, work on Phase 2 of the 2006 Environmental Bond Act has also begun. So far both the brick and stone walkways have been graded to accommodate ADA accessibility to the main entrance. Additional improvements included in Phase 2 are outdoor lighting in the parking lot and at the entrance on Port Washington Blvd. Parking space striping will also be done. We are all awaiting the day we will be able to return to Elderfields. Hopefully soon!





Our short-term goal was to clean up the patio and areas for the Members' Reception in June. We weeded, trimmed bushes, dug out and revised existing gardens. Pots on the patio were planted with annuals. Committee members brought their own tools, including, trowels, shovels, claws, loppers and clippers, even a pick-axe! They also contributed plants from their own gardens. Special thanks are due Rosemary Konatich who drew up plans for the rose garden and designed it to have perennials blooming from spring to fall, including iris, daylilies, daisies, phlox and echinachea.

Longer range projects include the creation of a Sculpture Garden on the right side of the property, as well as the creation of an azalea garden at the rear of the property on the left adjacent to the stone wall. We will plant Forsythia along the rear white fence and relocate the current lilac. We hope to expand the rose garden and to create an additional perennial garden.

I hope other members of TAG will consider joining the Garden Committee and help us to make Elderfields even more beautiful than it already is.


Encaustic Painting by R&F Paint


Lois accepted this honor with her mom by her side who was also celebrating something ... her 90th birthday!


