Message from the Co-Presidents



WORKSHOPS

FAST, LOOSE & BOLD WITH PATTI MOLLICA



On February 13 and 14, 2016, 14 artists took part in a two-day workshop "Fast, Loose & Bold," with artist Patti Mollica. They were guided through a series of exercises designed to teach them to paint confidently, use brilliant color, gestural brushwork and strong compositions.

Participants worked on small paintings

from images Patti provided. The images were chosen to demonstrate Patti's principles of creating dramatic paintings via strong composition, simple, large shapes. and bold color.

SILKSCREEN MONOTYPE WITH STEPHANIE NAVON-JACOBSON

On July 9 and 10, **Stephanie** Navon-Jacobson taught a **Silkscreen Monotype** Workshop to ten artists.

This monotype technique involves painting or drawing with water soluble mediums (watercolor, pastel, watercolor pencils or graphite) directly onto a silkscreen. When the painting is completed, prints are pulled. The



prints can be left as they are or, after drying, can be enhanced by drawing, painting or applying any sort of mixed media to them.

THE HIDDEN POWER OF WATERCOLOR WITH ANTONIO MASI



On August 3 - 5, the Art Guild was delighted to host **The Hidden Power** of Watercolor Workshop with Antonio Masi. Mr. Masi is the president of the American Watercolor Society and has been an educator and an artist for more than 40 years.

Eleven artists learned about Antonio's non-traditional approach to watercolor, which involves using oil painting brushes, gesso, big washes and a sense of spontaneity combined with careful planning. They also learned some technology tricks using an ipad.

Antonio's generous teaching style made this an interesting and challenging workshop. We are delighted to be honoring him at our Art Lover's Fling on November 18 (story on page 1).
