Happy New Year! I hope this finds you well. The Art Guild is off to an exciting start for 2019 and we're eager to tell you about all that's going on.

There are 10 multi-day visiting artist workshops scheduled for the rest of 2019 (see page 4), with something for everyone - photography, oils, pastels, colored pencil, and watercolor. We have classes six-days a week this Spring and are working on the Summer and Fall schedules. We enjoy broadening our members' artistic interests - if there's a class or subject that you're interested in, please let us know.

Nine open-juried and two invitational exhibits are planned for 2019. We are seeing an up-tick in the number of submissions per show and hope that will continue as more people become familiar with The Art Guild through workshops, classes and other events. It's exciting to know that we are reaching more artists all across the island and beyond.

We are thrilled to be partnering with several community organizations. In December, The Art Guild hosted eight disabled adult students from AHRC for a morning of abstract art. We plan to continue this program in 2019 and expand to include children with disabilities. One Cub Scout and two Girl Scout troops visited for docent-led tours and badge-earning art projects. We will be hosting a Mom's Night Out art-related event for the Port Washington Parent Resource Center, and hope to partner with the Port Washington Library for a series of art lectures.

As part of our education mandate, we are now taking applications for our annual scholarships for graduating high school seniors who will pursue art-related careers (deadline April 1). We will also be partnering with the Port Washington school district to give needs-based scholarships for talented students to take classes here at The Art Guild.

A sincere thank you to all of those who supported our Art Lover's Fling in December. A great time was had by all with our beloved honorees and over 200 guests, making it our most successful fundraising event ever!

I want to take thank you for reading this edition of TAGlines. All of this is possible because of the inspiring work and dedication of our staff, board, teachers, artists and supporters.

A Little Magic for AHRC Students

When AHRC, a not-for-profit that serves more than 2,000 people with special needs, asked for an experience to enhance the love of art for a few of their students, we invited them to Elderfields for a hands-on morning of abstract art, painting with nature and a dose of magic.

Eight students and two aides took a docent-led tour of *Abstractions: What is True for You?* Students learned about the many kinds of abstract paintings and how sparks of a dream or a flash of memory can be inspirational.



Instructor, Antonia Fthenakis, an educator with a focus on special needs, introduced students to items from nature that were historically used as art mediums. Students were encouraged to touch natural materials such as mustard seeds, coffee grinds and turmeric and transform these items into paints. Each student created a portfolio of their artworks and their own "magic potion" necklace.

We hope to expand this much-needed program to different centers on Long Island that work with individuals with special needs.

WORKSHOPS OCT. 2018 - JAN. 2019

EXPRESSIVE PASTELS WITH KAREN MARGULIS

Pastelist Karen Margulis, PSA, popular for her live painting videos and blog *Painting My World*, visited us October 26-28.

Daily demos by Karen (including lots of fun visual aids), included: how to use photos (use a bad small photo), "make a plan - plan to let go," and issued "artistic licenses" granting permission to make changes in pursuit of our artistic vision. Painting challenges for students helped illustrate methods of underpainting, exploring color, and using value studies and thumbnails to create exciting landscapes.



PREMIER COUP WITH DUANE KEISER



Duane Kaiser visited the Art Guild January 19 - 20 and shared his strategies and techniques for "First Strike" or "Premier Coup" painting with 15 artists.

Students were challenged to paint an object in 10 seconds, wipe down the canvas paper, and repeat many times over. This exercise was a painterly exploration of painting in the moment, and gaining control with each pass.

Duane was a thoughtful and generous teacher challenging the artists to achieve precision with their painting.

OFF THE WHEEL CERAMICS WITH PATRICIA BRIDGES

Local ceramic artist, **Patricia Bridges** taught six enthusiastic students some great fundamentals of hand building with clay. After a brief introduction, students jumped in to make actual pieces.

Bridges auided them through the creative possibilities, exploring texture by using textiles, rollers, and natural materials to decorate their work. Each student was able make a few functional pieces of art including a tea caddy, utensil holder and a bowl. Students chose the glazes for their pieces which Bridges took back to her studio to be fired. We can't wait to see the results!

Painting the Figure from Photographs in Watercolor with Ted Nuttall: June 19-22 • 9am - 4pm • \$625M/\$660NM Don't miss the opportunity to take a workshop with this amazing watercolorist in New York! Ted Nuttall demonstrates techniques and instills the confidence to enjoy painting people. He will discuss the benefits of photographic reference, as well as how to interpret a photo in order to give life and energy to the subject. One spot left!

Painting with Colored Pencils, Fine Art Workshop with Cynthia Knox, CPSA: July 26-28 • \$460M/\$495NM Students will be guided step by step through the process of creating this stunning still life (photo right) and will demonstrate her signature style of painting with colored pencil. Tips and tech-









niques will be taught that will enable each artist to render the lace, fruit, flower, wood and metallic textures in this composition. Group and individual instruction, a high-quality glossy tutorial booklet, reference photo, 'cheat sheet,' and the actual surface with a light outline will be provided. Deposits being taken now.
